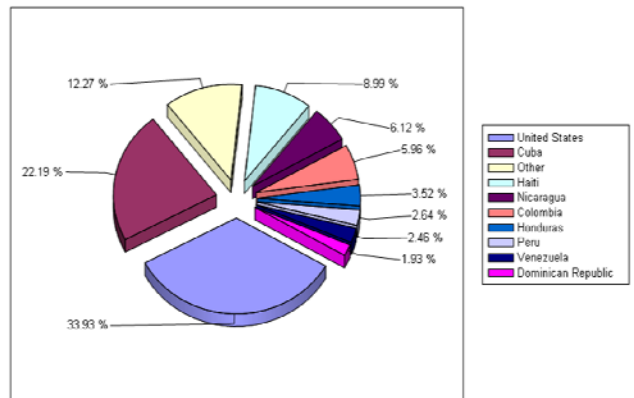
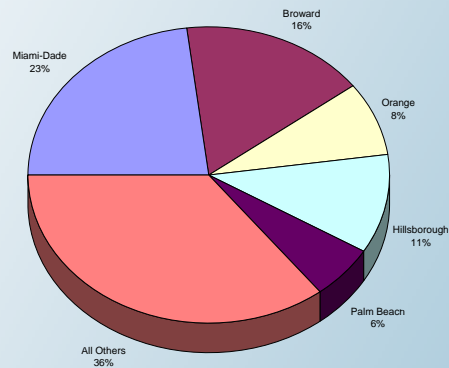

High School Completion

- 32,003 students enrolled in high school completion courses last reporting year
 - 24,268 (76%) earned at least ½ credit towards graduation
- Of the 17,418 students who earned a high school diploma, 9,109 (52%) attended adult high school completion courses at some point during their high school experience

Enrollment and Demographics

- M-DCPS served **107,162 students** in Workforce Education (Adult Education and Career Technical Courses) . This accounted for **21.8% of all students in school districts statewide**
- Of the total above, M-DCPS served:
 - 94,800 students in adult general education programs, which constituted 25.5% of all students in school districts statewide
 - 10,380 students in career technical programs, or 18.9% of all students in school districts statewide
 - 1,001 students in apprenticeship programs, or 8.9% of all students in school districts statewide



- Of the students served in the last reporting year:
 - 95.6% were from a minority racial/ethnic group
 - 6.4% had a documented disability
 - **66% were foreign born**
 - 56.9% were Limited English Proficient

- 1,456 were served in correctional facilities

Job Placement and Continuing Education

- Of the 4,424 eligible completers in career technical programs in the previous reporting year, 79% were found employed or articulating to higher education the following year

Staffing

- Part-time employees accounted for 81% of all school staff involved with adult education
 - Part-time teachers accounted for 94% of all teachers in adult education
