M-DCPS PLACED ON THE COLLEGE BOARD'S 6TH ANNUAL AP® DISTRICT HONOR ROLL FOR SIGNIFICANT GAINS IN STUDENT ACCESS AND SUCCESS

Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) once again is being honored by the College Board with placement on the 6th Annual AP® District Honor Roll for increasing access to Advanced Placement (AP) course work while simultaneously maintaining or increasing the percentage of students earning scores of 3 or higher on AP Exams. Reaching these goals indicates that a district is successfully identifying motivated, academically prepared students who are ready for the opportunity of AP. To be included on the 6th Annual Honor Roll, M-DCPS had to, since 2013, increase the number of students participating in AP while also increasing or maintaining the number of students earning AP Exam scores of 3 or higher.

This honor re-emphasizes M-DCPS's commitment to advanced academics: In 2014, the district was named the College Board Advanced Placement Equity and Excellence District of the Year for being the nation's number one leader, among large school districts, in expanding access to Advanced Placement Program (AP) courses and improving AP Exam performance.

National data from 2015 show that among black/African American, Hispanic, and Native American students with a high degree of readiness for AP, only about half of students are participating. The first step to delivering the opportunity of AP to students is providing access by ensuring courses are available, that gatekeeping stops, and that the doors are equitably opened so these students can participate. Miami-Dade County Public Schools is committed to expanding the availability of AP courses among prepared and motivated students of all backgrounds.

M-DCPS PROVIDES FREE FLUMIST TO STUDENTS, 'TEACH FLU A LESSON' INITIATIVE

M-DCPS CELEBRATES GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND RIBBON-CUTTING EVENT AT PALM LAKES ELEMENTARY & THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF VOTER APPROVAL

Superintendent of Schools Alberto M. Carvalho, community leaders, District and school administrators, teachers, students and parents gathered recently at the newly-renovated Palm Lakes Elementary School to celebrate the renovations performed on the school as well as the third anniversary of voter approval of the \$1.2 billion General Obligation Bond by Miami-Dade County voters.

To date, 64 projects have been completed and more than 200 projects are in progress. Miami-Dade County Public Schools has already invested \$200 million, with another \$120 million committed, continuing its promise to deliver quality projects on time and under budget.

VALUES MATTER IN AND OUT OF THE CLASSROOM AT M-DCPS

As the school year progresses at M-DCPS, we continue to emphasize the District's core values to reinforce the development of positive behavior in our students. Each month, we are focusing on one specific value. During the month of September, we focused on the value of Responsibility. Two student winners and one school were recognized at the School Board's monthly meeting as Values Matter Students/School of the Month.



The Values Matter Student of the Month at the elementary level is Steven Mejia, a first-grader from Dr. Carlos J. Finlay Elementary. Zaire Gladden, a seventh-grade student from Country Club Middle School is the Values Matter Student of the Month at the secondary level.

The Values Matter School of the Month was awarded to Flagami Elementary School. For the month of December, schools throughout the District will be highlighting Fairness.

In addition, all senior high schools participated in Values Matter in Athletics, an extension of the on-going Values Matter initiative. High schools throughout the district participated in activities highlighting the connection between good sportsmanship and behaviors aligned with core values.

As part of this effort to promote values in athletics, M-DCPS partnered with the Greater Miami Athletic Conference in sponsoring 17 Values Matter football games. These games, which closed out the regular season in Miami-Dade County, highlighted the Values Matter in Athletics initiative. Nearly 2,000 football players from Miami-Dade County Public Schools wore Values Matter stickers on their helmets.

HANTMAN, BENDROSS-MINDINGALL CHOSEN TO LEAD MIAMIDADE SCHOOL BOARD

Perla Tabares Hantman, School Board Member and Chair for the past five years, was elected for the sixth consecutive time as Chair of the Miami-Dade County School Board for the year ahead. Ms. Hantman will serve for an unprecedented ninth time as Chair since she was first elected to the School Board in 1996 to represent District 4. She was the first Hispanic woman to serve as Chair, and has previously served from 1999-2001, and then each consecutive year from 2010-2015.

Dr. Dorothy Bendross-Mindingall was elected for the first time as Vice Chair. This appointment makes her the first African-American woman in Miami-Dade County Public Schools to be chosen for the position. Dr. Bendross-Mindingall, who represents District 2, was elected to the School Board in 2010.

M-DCPS HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN TEN80 STEMFEST EXPO & INVITATIONAL

Student teams from some 17 Miami-Dade County public high schools competed against each other at the Ten80 STEMFest Expo and Invitational Race Challenge at iTech @ Thomas A. Edison Educational Center. Schools have been competing all year to win an invitation to the 2016 National STEM League Finals where they will test their skills against more than 30 teams from around the country.
